#### Key Vocabulary

**Boar**-A wild pig

**Fossils**- The parts of a dead animal or plant that have become hard and turned into rock

**Habitat**- The place where a particular type of animal or plant is normally found

**Location**-A place where something happens or exists

**Map**- A drawing or plan of the Earth's surface or part of it, showing features like countries, towns and rivers

**Report**-A written or spoken account of an event

**Symbol**-A sign, number or letter that has a fixed meaning



During our visit to Shipley, we will travel on the Shipley Glen Tramway and identify its changes over time. We will also explore fossils, plants and habitats from Shipley Glen and Baildon Moor, allowing us to create some wonderful outdoor sculpture work!
