The school day

New classrooms and drop off/ pick up points!:

We have changed some of our teaching spaces in school, ready for a fresh start in September. The Reception class and Year 4 have swapped. Year's 1 and 3 have swapped and Years 5 and 6 have swapped. Year 2 will remain in the same classroom. We will then have one part of school (the newest bit) for KS1 (years 1,2) and the other part of the school for KS2 (years 3,4,5,6).

Reception will be dropped off via the spiritual garden. Years 1 and 2 will use the current year 1 entrance, off the main playground, years 3 and 4 will use the current Reception entrance and years 5 and 6 will use the current year 5 and 6 door, off the main playground. Staff will be on the playground to help anyone who needs it!

Timings:

For pupils not attending breakfast club, you will be able to enter the school site from **8:35am until 8:40am**. Collective worship will begin at **8:45 am prompt**.

School Day

Breakfast Club:

If your child attends breakfast club, they should enter the building at the current

year five/ six entrance, on the main playground. Please ensure any outstanding balance for this are cleared before returning in September. If your account is in arrears unfortunately we will not be able to guarantee you a space. **Late pupils:**

Children must arrive promptly at their classroom doors by **8:40 am**. At 8:40 the gate at the top of the playground will be locked. If pupils arrive after this, they will need to go to the school office. Pupils should be dropped off at the office and a member of staff will take them to their classroom or to the hall for collective worship.

Lunchtimes:

Children can choose to bring a packed lunch from home or have a dinner prepared by school. The school lunch choices will be sent home to parents and can be viewed on the school's website. We would ask that as usual, children bring a water bottle each day; this must be clearly labelled with their name and is for their use only. In September, we will continue to use the school hall for pupils to eat their dinners.

End of the school day:

Pupils can be collected from **3:10-3:15pm Monday-Thursday and 1:05-1:10pm on Fridays.** If your child walks home on their own, they can continue as they usually would and they will leave classrooms at **3:15pm.** We ask that parents be patient during home time routines as staff want to ensure pupils leave their care safely.

After School Clubs:

We will be continuing with our full offer of after school clubs from the autumn term for children in Years 1-6. The clubs will be available Monday-Thursday from 3:15-4:15. Reception pupils will be able to attend clubs later in the school year. More information about the after school clubs will be sent home when the autumn term begins. We will continue to offer childcare for those families who require their children to remain in school on a Friday afternoon. Childcare places are limited and are currently only available to families where both parents work. If you do not currently use this provision but would like to apply for a place, please contact the school office for an application form.

School information

Uniform:

Children should wear school uniform when they return in September and continue to come to school in their PE kit on their PE day, PE days will be confirmed on our return in September.

Our PE kit consists of a plain white t-shirt, family hoodie and black or navy jogging bottoms. **There will be class rewards for classes who all wear the correct uniform to school.** If your child arrives to school wearing the incorrect PE kit we will send a reminder message about the correct uniform via ClassDojo.

Equipment:

In September we will have limited space inside the building and will no longer be able to provide locker storage for each pupil, we therefore ask that **only small book bags are brought to school as per the image attached.** Any educational resources that your child needs will be provided by school;

they do not need to bring in pencil cases or stationery.

Children in Years 5 & 6 should only bring mobile phones

into school if this is **absolutely necessary**, these should be handed to

the teacher each morning and can be collected at the end of the school day.

- Long hair must be tied back and jewellery must be removed before the lesson



School milk

From September 2023 parents/carers will be able to purchase milk for their child in school via Fresh Pastures. The process of ordering and paying for your child's milk is quick and easy and you can pay for each term (3 times a year) or for the full academic year to September.

Milk for the under-fives is free until the beginning of the term in which the child turns five, if your child will turn 5 during their first term at St Paul's, and you would like them to receive milk, this will need to be ordered and paid for via the website above.

Walking Home

If you would like to provide consent for your child in Year 5 or 6 to walk home from school without an adult, please request a consent form from the school office. If you have previously provided consent please be aware we will require a new form to be completed for the new academic year.

Attendance

We finish this academic year with an overall school attendance of 93.3% 11 pupils have maintained their 100% attendance throughout the whole year- well done!

24 families have been issued with a fixed penalty notice from Bradford Council for taking unauthorised time off from school for the purpose of attending a holiday.

Please be reminded leave during term time can be authorised in exceptional circumstances only.

From September 2023 our school attendance will be monitored termly by a link worker from Bradford Council who will also be monitoring pupil's punctuality and meeting with parents to address any concerns.

Please be reminded late arrival and non-attendance e.g repeated illness at school can also lead to fixed penalty notices being issued by Bradford Council.

Where families take two or more periods of unauthorised leave in a 12-month period (totalling 10 school days or more), or when a period of four or more weeks of leave is taken, Bradford Council will utilise the option to start legal proceedings via the magistrates' court, instead of issuing a penalty notice. This means that parents may be liable to receive a significantly higher fine (up to £2,500 per child, per parent) if found guilty, as well as receive a criminal record, which may be reportable to employers (for example, via a DBS Check). In rare circumstances, magistrates can consider a custodial sentence for up to 3 months. This change came into force from 1st April 2023.

Mrs Moore will continue to support families to improve the attendance of our school community, in line with the government drive to ensure that pupils are in school and on time.
