September reminders

School reopens for the new academic year on Tuesday 03 September 2024. Following our recent consultation the school day will now start at 8:30am each day. The finish time will be 3:20pm on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and 1:45pm on a Friday.

September reminders

Breakfast Club:

If your child attends breakfast club, they should enter the building at the current year five/ six entrance, on the main playground.

Breakfast club will recommence on Tuesday 03 September. Current bookings will continue unless we are notified otherwise. Please ensure any outstanding balances for this are cleared before returning in September. If your account is in arrears unfortunately, we will not be able to guarantee you a space in September.

Rainbow Squad:

Our Rainbow Squad childcare provision will recommence on Tuesday 03 September. Current bookings will continue unless we are notified otherwise.

The Rainbow Squad childcare is available every Monday to Friday, 3:20pm to 5pm at £6 per day. To reserve a new place, or to amend your current booking, contact the school office.

Late pupils:

Children must arrive promptly at their classroom doors between **8:25am** and **8:30am**. At 8:30am the gate at the top of the playground will be locked. If pupils arrive after this, they will need to go to the school office with their parent/guardian to be signed in and provide the reason for lateness. Pupils should be dropped off at the office and a member of staff will take them to their classroom or to the hall for collective worship.

Collective worship:

In September, we are continuing to start each school day with Collective worship. The worship has a different theme every day -reading and singing for example and is a great way for all pupils and staff to come together as a 'St Paul's family'.

Lunchtimes:

Children can choose to bring a packed lunch from home or have a dinner prepared by school. The school lunch choices can be viewed on https://schoolmeals.bradford.gov.uk/. We would ask that as usual, children bring a water bottle each day; this must be clearly labelled with their name and is for their use only. In September, we will continue to use the school hall for pupils to eat their dinners.

End of the school day:

Pupils can be collected at **3:20pm Monday-Thursday and 1:45pm on Fridays.** If your child walks home on their own, they will leave classrooms at **3:20pm.** We ask that parents be patient during home time routines as staff want to ensure pupils leave their care safely.

After School Clubs and Friday afternoon childcare:

We will be continuing with our full offer of after school clubs from the autumn term for children in Years 1-6. Varying clubs will be available on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. Reception pupils will be able to attend clubs later in the school year.

More information about the after-school clubs will be sent home when the autumn term begins. We will continue to offer childcare for those families who require their children to remain in school on a Friday afternoon until 3:20pm.

These childcare places are limited and are currently only available to families where both parents work. If you do not currently use this provision, but would like to apply for a place, please contact the school office for an application form.

September reminders

Uniform:

Children should wear full school uniform when they return in September and continue to come to school in their PE kit on their PE day, PE days will be confirmed in September. Our PE kit consists of a plain white t-shirt, family hoodie and black or navy jogging bottoms. *There will be class rewards for classes who all wear the correct uniform to school.* If your child arrives to school wearing the incorrect PE kit we will send a reminder message about the correct uniform via ClassDojo.

Equipment:

Due to limited storage space we ask that pupils only bring **small book bags to school** Any educational resources that your child needs will be provided by school; they **do not need to bring in pencil cases or stationery.** Only children in Years 5 & 6 should are permitted to bring mobile phones to school and these must be handed to the class teacher each morning

School milk

If you would like your child to receive milk from September 2024 this can be ordered directly from Coolmilk.com.Milk for the under-fives is free until the beginning of the term in which the child turns five, if your child will turn 5 during their first term at St Paul's, and you would like them to receive milk, this will need to be ordered and paid for via the website above.

Toast time

We will be continuing to serve toast during break time each day. If you would like your child to receive toast for the Autumn Term 1, please pay via ParentPay by Tuesday 27 August. Please be reminded we cannot accept late orders due our bread delivery set up.

Free toast and milk for pupils.

Free toast and milk will continue to be provided to pupils in receipt of income based free school meals and does not need to be pre-ordered. To check if your child is eligible for income based free school meals please visit:

Collection from the office

We have an increasing number of families requesting children to be waiting in the school office ready to be collected early for various reasons. Please be aware due to the open plan nature of this area we can no longer have children waiting here for extended periods of time due to confidentiality. If you need to collect your child early, we will collect children from class when you have arrived.

Attendance

New Government guidance regarding school attendance will come into effect in August 2024. Upcoming changes will include a higher penalty notice for unauthorised absences from school (this includes holidays in term time, persistent lates, unauthorised time off for repeated illnesses that cannot be evidenced or any other absences without a valid reason)

We will continue to work with parents and the local authority to avoid families receiving penalty notices, where possible, by providing support through our Early Help network.

Families with ongoing attendance concerns, who have exhausted all other support measures may be referred to Bradford Council who may conduct a criminal investigation and consider whether to instigate legal proceedings for an offence under Section 444 of the 1996 Education Act:

"If a child of compulsory school age who is a registered pupil at a school fails to attend regularly at the school, their parent is guilty of an offence."

In total this academic year **61 pupils took time off due to going on holiday during term time**. These pupils collectively **missed 233 days of school**.

This not only disrupts your child's learning but also the learning of classmates due to needing to provide these pupils with catch up sessions on the work/explanations of work they have missed.

Walking Home permissions for years 5 and 6

If you would like to provide consent for your child in Year 5 or 6 to walk home from school without an adult, please request a consent form from the school office.

If you have previously provided consent please be aware we will require a new form to be completed for the new academic year.

Summer Reading Challenges

Children can get creative with this year's Summer Reading Challenge, Marvellous Makers! The Challenge runs every year throughout the summer holidays, and all children aged 4-11 are welcome to take part!
