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News around the school...

During this half term pupils have been on various trips around the district to learn more about the areas their classes are named after.



Year 3 also spent the day living as Victorian school children and learned about how different school would have been then.

To mark the Harvest festival we collected donations for the St Paul's Church food bank.



We hosted our annual fundraiser for Macmillan Cancer research and raised a total of £99 to donate towards this worthwhile cause. Our parent governor judged the Bake-Off entries and Miss Beaumont was crowned this year's winner!



Attendance.....

As a school we aim for an overall attendance figure of 96%, our current whole school attendance is 94.9%.

Since returning in September **17 children have been absent from school due to taking unauthorised holidays. In total these children have missed 79 learning days from school.**

88 children have also missed a total of 187 learning days due to sickness, many of these days off have been one day absences. It can be tricky deciding whether to keep your child off school when they're unwell. It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or common cold but if they have a very high temperature, please keep them off school until these eases. Your holiday will not be authorised and you must talk to the school before you book anything. Because your child will miss 5 school days you will be given a penalty notice fine. The fine is £160 but if you pay it in 21 days it will be reduced to £80.

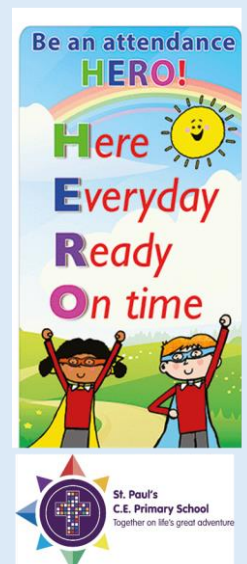

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Clean air grant funding...

Earlier this year we were successful in gaining a grant from The Bradford Clean Air Schools Programme (CASP). CASP is a Bradford Council initiative funded by the Bradford Clean Air Zone (CAZ) to help reductions in pollution outside schools especially those located next to busy main roads.

With the money received we have already bought and installed a bike and scooter storage facility and over the summer we took delivery of our custom-made planters and screens. During the half term break these planters will be filled with soil ready for planting. Over the next few years it is hoped the foliage from the plants will grow and spread across the screens and onto the wire fencing to allow for a natural screening from the road pollution.

In addition to the planters we have also purchased additional seating that will be installed along the church boundary wall away from the main road.

We have lots of exciting events planned for the Spring and Summer terms to get pupils and families involved in the maintenance of the planters and will share further details closer to the time.

School meal price increase...

Due to the increasing associated costs of producing school meals we have been notified the daily price will increase to £2.35 per pupil from 04 November 2024.

Can I apply for free school meals? You can apply for free school meals if you receive:

Income Support

Income Based Jobseekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided they are not receiving Working Tax Credit

the 'Guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit

Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7,400

Every child over the age of five is entitled to milk at a subsidised cost of around £20 per term. Register your child and pay online.

Children in receipt of benefits-based free school meals are eligible for free school milk. Speak to the school for further information.

Free milk for under 5s is funded by The Department of Health and milk for over 5s is subsidised by DEFRA.
